WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD PURPOSES GRANT?

A Neighborhood Purposes Grants (NPG) is an award of public funds to a 501(c)(3) or public school for a project that will benefit the public. NPGs are outlined in the Los Angeles Administrative Code 22.817, "an NPG is a grant an NC is provide a 501c3 (excluding non-religious institutions) or public schools for the purposes of providing a public benefit."

04 THE GRANT REQUEST MAY THEN BE SCHEDULED FOR DISCUSSION AND VOTE AT THE DEL REY NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL BOARD MEETING, HELD ON 2ND THURSDAYS @ 7PM.

05 IF APPROVED BY THE BOARD, CHECKS ARE DELIVERED BY THE CITY WITHIN 4-6 WEEKS, AND THE APPLICANT IS ASKED TO FOLLOW-UP WITH THE BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE TO REPORT ON THE USE OF FUNDS (PICTURES WELCOME!)
